Doctor Brother Norman Vincent Peal was born in Bowersville Ohio on May 31, 1898. Brother Peale grew up helping support his family by

delivering newspapers, working in a grocery store, selling pots and pans door to door, and later became one of the most influential clergymen in the world during the 20th century. H was educated in Ohio and Boston prior to entering the ministry and went on to author some 40 books He became Pastor of Marble Collegiate Church in New York City (1932-1984) where he gained fame for his sermons on a positive approach to modern life. The church had 600 members when he arrive as Pastor, and over 5,000 when he retired in 1984

Of the many books Brother Peale authored, the most famous is "The Power of Positive Thinking." book that helps YOU deal with the trials and tribulations of daily life. A chapter of particular interest is "You Don't Have To Kick Over The Hive To Get The Honey." A philosophy I have tried to inculcate in my life as well as my children's, and now my grandchildren's lives.

In a nutshell it is the Biblical equivalent of "Love thy neighbor as thyself", or Masonically "...do goo unto all..." of the Master Masons charge. These teachings, although thousands of years old, hold a true today as when they were first carved in stone I highly recommend Dr. Brother Norman Vincent Peale's writings to all who maybe looking for a check-up from the neck-up.
