# **Kempsville Milestone Coming Up**

By the time this edition of the Ashlar hits your mailbox, Kempsville Lodge will have raised its 797<sup>th</sup> Master Mason since being chartered in 1954. We'll raise one more on November 16<sup>th</sup> setting the stage for number 800 sometime early in 2011. Thanks to some research by Worshipful Bob Stanek and Brother Jerry Hallal, some interesting facts have been pulled from the archives:

- The 100<sup>th</sup> Master Mason was raised in 1961
- The 200<sup>th</sup> Master Mason was raised in 1965
- The 300<sup>th</sup> Master Mason was raised in 1972
- The 400<sup>th</sup> Master Mason was raised in 1978 • The 500<sup>th</sup> Master Mason was raised in 1988
- The 600<sup>th</sup> Master Mason was raised in 1996
- The 700th Master Mason was raised in 2004
- Average number of Master Masons raised per vear: 14
- Years that raised more than 20 Master Masons: 1961, 1694, 1965, 1966, 1976, 1996, 2005.
- Most Master Masons raised in a single year: 35 (1964, Worshipful Grayson Amazaih Pearce)
