November has an awful lot of stuff packed into its thirty days. It begins with the recovery and sharing of the bounty obtained from the last night of

the previous month. It hosts the celebration of the feast of all the saints. At least every other year, on the second Tuesday of the month, an election is held. The Grand Annual Communication is convened in Richmond, the first frost occurs, football fans cheer their favorite team and shoppers eagerly anticipate and plan out their shopping strategy for Black Friday.

Amidst the whirlwind of activities that November generates, let us not forget two extremely important dates. The first recalls the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month in 1918, on which an agreement, ceasing hostilities between the Allied nations and Germany, ending World War I went into effect. This day was originally called Armistice Day. Congress, after WW II and the Korean Conflict enacted legislation which would forever give honor on that date to veterans of all wars. Thank you for your service.

The second date is one on my favorites. It has come to be celebrated on the last Thursday of the month.
