## **From The East**



On the 11<sup>th</sup> hour of the 11<sup>th</sup> day of the 11<sup>th</sup> month of 1918 an armistice between Germany and the Allied nations came into effect. On November 11, 1919, Armistice Day

was commemorated for the first time. In 1919, President Wilson proclaimed the day should be "filled with solemn pride in the heroism of those who died in the country's service and with gratitude for the victory." There were plans for parades, public meetings and a brief suspension of business activities at 11AM. In 1926, the United States Congress officially recognized the end of World War I and declared that the anniversary of the armistice should be commemorated with prayer and thanksgiving. The Congress also requested that the president should "issue a proclamation calling upon the officials to display the flag of the United States on all Government buildings on November 11 and inviting the people of the United States to observe the day in schools and churches, or other suitable places, with appropriate ceremonies of friendly relations with all other peoples." An Act was approved on May 13, 1938, which made November 11 in each year a legal holiday, known as Armistice Day. This day was originally intended to honor veterans of World War I. A few years later, World War II required the largest mobilization of service men in the history of the United States and the American forces fought in Korea. In 1954, the veteran's service organizations urged Congress to change the word "Armistice" to "Veterans." Congress approved this change and on June 1, 1954, November 11 became a day to honor all American veterans, wherever and whenever they had served.

My November article reflects on Masons who supported The United States by putting on a uniform, buttoning a chinstrap, picking up a gun, saddling a horse, strapping on an

airplane, driving a ship, and many of the other things that patriots have done in support of this country. We will most appropriately hold our November Stated Communication on Veteran's Day.

Notable is that Brother Raymond Weeks, a World War II veteran, organized "National Veterans Day," which included a parade and other festivities to honor all veterans in Birmingham, Alabama in 1947. The event was held on 11 November and was designated Armistice Day. Later, U.S. Representative Edward Rees of Kansas proposed a bill that would change Armistice Day to Veterans Day. In 1954, Congress passed the bill that President Eisenhower signed proclaiming 11 November as Veterans Day. Brother Weeks received the Presidential Citizens Medal from President Reagan in November 1982.

Did you know that these military patriots are your Brothers?

Aldrin, Edwin E. "Buzz" Astronaut, second man on the moon, Montclair Lodge No. 144 New Jersey; Allen, Ethan - General, Revolutionary War; Windsor, Vermont; Arnold, Henry "Hap" – General, Commander of the Army Air Force during World War II; Bradley, Omar N. - Five Star General of the Army, World War II; Byrd, Richard E. – Admiral, Arctic & Antarctic explorer, 1st to fly over North Pole.

Some pretty big names and many more that can be found, but in any Lodge they are merely Brothers who stood ready to "saddle up, lock and load" when America called.


