Tribute to a "Pillar"

One of the "pillars" of our Lodge passed to the Celestial Lodge recently. Worshipful **Brother Michael** Lombardo, more commonly referred to as Worshipful Mike, "Dad Mike", or just "Mike", passed away after living a wonderful life of 93 years. He spent 66 years of his 93 as a Master Mason. He became a Mason in



Naval Lodge No. 4, Washington, D.C. in 1948. He later moved to Norfolk, and soon affiliated with Kempsville Lodge No. 196 in 1958. Mike served at Worshipful Master of Kempsville Lodge in 1974, after "going through the chairs".

Not only active in our Lodge, Mike and his wife Dottie also joined and became very active in Kempsville Chapter No. 173, Order of the Eastern Star, and served that organization as their Worthy Patron. Most notably, Mike worked very actively in and with our youth organizations; both the Job's Daughters and DeMolay – thus his title of "Dad". Both youth organizations paid their respects to his memory at his recent memorial service.

He attended Lodge regularly until failing health prevented further attendance.

If anyone were ever wished to pattern their life around a kind, gentle, and honorable man, with much character and integrity, they need look no further than to use Worshipful Mike as an example. We will miss him, as will all who know him. May God Bless his gentle soul.
