This being my final Junior Warden's Ashlar input I would like to thank everyone who supported our degree teams over the past 2 years. By the numbers, our degree teams completed

56 degrees raising 21 Master Masons in 2 years time. Putting these numbers into a 2-year percentage makes it clear what your Lodge has completed. In the 2 years that contained 104 weeks in which we are traditionally dark for 8 weeks over a 2 year period (4 weeks per year), the Lodge conducted 24 Stated Communications and as mentioned 56 degrees. Thus your Lodge Officers were in the chairs during 80 of the available 96 weeks, or 83% of the available time.

These efforts have helped maintain the number of Brothers on our roles and have subsequently kept Kempsville Lodge as the largest Masonic Lodge in Virginia. Additionally, during the same time Worshipful Steve Ridgeway and Worshipful Bill Peterson have been very diligent in reaching out to Brothers who were in arrears to the Lodge, their efforts were also a salient contributing factor in our census remaining steady.

Further thanks go to the Past Masters and other Brothers who supported the degrees, without their support we would have not conducted a single event. Additional thanks go to the coaches who prepared the candidates, again without them nothing would have happened. A final thanks goes to Right Worshipful Tom McGowan who served as Lodge Instructor of Work. Tom conducted school every Monday night and was in Lodge every Tuesday night, and he gave fantastic instruction and was very patient with the learners.

This accomplishment was a true team effort that I am very proud and thankful to have been a part of it. I hope to see you in Lodge soon!
