Brother Arnold Jacob "Red" Auerbach

Brother Arnold Jacob "Red" Auerbach (Ezekiel Bates Lodge, Attleboro, Massachusetts) was an American basketball coach of the Washington Capitols, the Tri-Cities Blackhawks and the Boston Celtics. After he retired from coaching, he served as president and front office executive of the Celtics until his death. As a coach, he won 938 games (a record at his retirement) and nine National Basketball Association (NBA) championships in ten years (a number surpassed only by Phil Jackson, who won 11 in twenty years). As general manager and team president of the Celtics, he won an additional seven NBA titles, for a grand total of 16 in a span of 29 years, making him one of the most successful team officials in the history of North American professional sports.

Auerbach is remembered as a pioneer of modern basketball, redefining basketball as a game dominated by team play and defense and for introducing the fast break as a potent offensive weapon. He groomed many players who went on to be inducted into the Basketball Hall of Fame. Additionally, Auerbach was vital in breaking down color barriers in the NBA. He made history by drafting the first African-American NBA player, Chuck Cooper in 1950, introduced the first African-American starting five in 1964, and hired the first African-American head coach in North American sports (Bill



Russell in 1966). Famous for his polarizing nature, he was well known for smoking a cigar (illegal today) when he thought a victory was assured, a habit that became, for many, "the ultimate symbol of victory" during his Boston tenure.

In 1967, the NBA Coach of the Year award, which he had won in 1965, was named the "Red Auerbach Trophy", and Auerbach was inducted into the Basketball Hall of Fame in 1969. In 1980, he was named the greatest coach in the history of the NBA by the Professional Basketball Writers Association of America, and was NBA Executive of the Year in 1980. In addition, Auerbach was voted one of the NBA 10 Greatest Coaches in history, was inducted into the National Jewish Sports Hall of Fame, and is honored with a retired number 2 jersey in the TD Garden, the home of the Boston Celtics.

Brother Auerback passed to the Celestial Lodge on October 28, 2006 in Washington, DC.

Freemasonry: Diversity of Opinion; **Unity of Purpose**

"How interesting it is to see brothers so diametrically opposed on issues but united in the principles and purposes of Freemasonry."

These are the words of the Reverend and Right Worshipful Brother Bruce R. Bellmore, Grand Chaplain of the Grand Lodge of Connecticut, in his regular column, "Grand Chaplain's Pulpit," in the July-August, 2014 issue of the Connecticut Mason.

His comments followed two recent Supreme Court decisions, in which the social media, as well as many ordinary citizens, made strong comments on both sides of the issues.

"What I found particularly interesting was the wide range of opinions expressed by my brothers on these rulings," Brother Bellmore wrote. "Some of my brothers felt that these decisions were vindications of the Constitution while other brothers felt that this was a very dark day for American jurisprudence."

We meet in the Lodge on the level of equality, united in the principles of brotherly love, relief, and truth, he stated.

Whether differences of opinion exist in political or social situations outside the Lodge – or by opposing beliefs even on matters of importance within a Lodge or Grand Lodge - we, as Masons, should remember our obligations and keep our principles ever before us, Brother Bellmore said.

The United States was founded on the belief that. in spite of our differences of opinions, we are united. As Masons, the Connecticut Grand Chaplain concluded, "Let us ever stand united in the bonds of brotherhood."
